










This early college program allows you to begin your college-level studies early and go on to finish your four-year degree early too! Take classes to complete a U.S. high school diploma and prepare to transfer to a university at the same time. This program is open to students who have completed the equivalent of 9th grade in the U.S. and are at least 16 years old.

COSTS



Requirements

Applicants must be 16 years old or older by the start of International Student Orientation

- Application (\$50 fee)
- A bank statement or letter from sponsor (bank statement must be current and show a minimum balance of \$21,150)
- High school transcripts (academic records)
