2+2 University Transfer

Complete the first two years of your bachelor's degree at Shoreline in over 90 fields of study. Then, with guidance from our expert academic advisors, transfer to top-ranked universities across the United States where you complete your final two years and earn your bachelor's degree.



High School Completion Plus

This early college program allows you to begin your college-level studies early and go on to finish your four-year degree early too! Take classes to complete a U.S. high school diploma and prepare to transfer to a university at the same time. This program is open to students who have completed the equivalent of 9th grade in the U.S. and are at least 16 years old.

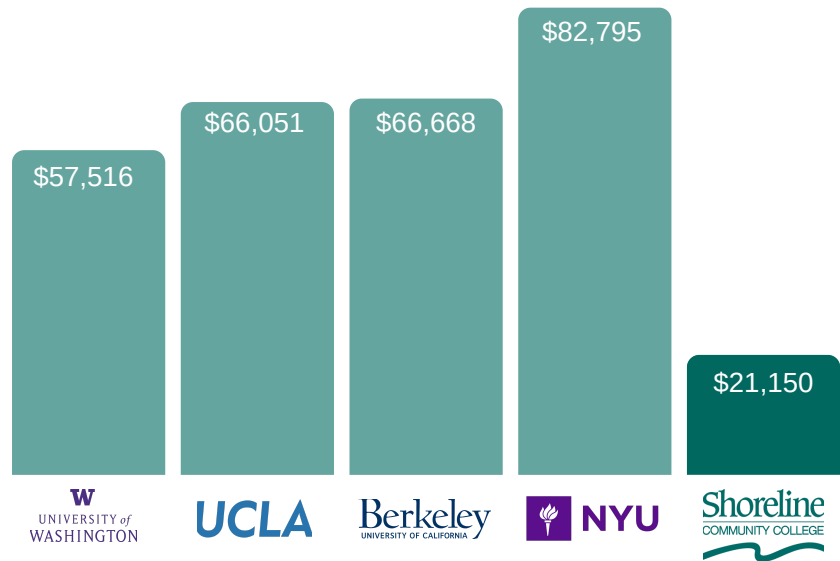

ADMISSION

The application process at Shoreline is simple, fast, and convenient. **You can start at Shoreline four different times throughout the year: January, April, July, and September.**

Submission of TOEFL, IELTS, SAT, or ACT not required for admission.

Requirements

Applicants must be 16 years old or older by the start of International Student Orientation

- **Application** (\$50 fee)
- **A bank statement or letter from sponsor** (bank statement must be current and show a minimum balance of \$21,150)
- **High school transcripts** (academic records)
