



Each of the five residential colleges in College Row also offer:





#### English language courses for pathway programs

UWA College English language courses are provided by The Centre for English Language Teaching (CELT) at UWA. If you need to improve your language skills for a pathway program, CELT offers high-quality English language tuition in a supportive and friendly environment.

#### How can I improve my English skills?

CELT's Language and Communication Essentials program is designed to improve your English language skills and prepare you for further academic study at UWA College. This language program can be packaged with your chosen UWA College pathway and UWA degree, giving you everything you need under a single study plan and visa – so you won't have to take another language test on completion.

#### What will I learn?

You'll learn English skills through:

- · discussing interesting topics and taking part in conversations
- · reading and understanding English texts
- · writing clearly and accurately
- · listening to different varieties of spoken English
- learning how to use correct grammar and vocabulary.

#### When can I start?

Language and Communication Essentials is taught in five-week modules throughout the year. This gives you flexibility on when you start, allowing you to finish the course in time to enrol on your academic program.



#### **UWA Foundation Program progression options**

The UWA Foundation Program offers students progression to all undergraduate courses at UWA. On the successful completion of your UWA Foundation Program, you could progress to a range of UWA courses, including:

Comprehensive degree: choose one or two majors from a wide range of offerings, then add electives and/or a minor to suit your interests and career goals. Bachelor's degree and complete two degrees in

Specialised degree: take an extended major with a carefully designed study plan to give you in-depth knowledge of your chosen career.

Combined Bachelor's degree: complete two degrees in normally just four years, one comprehensive and one specialised.

Combined Bachelor's and Master's degree: start postgraduate-level studies in the third year of your

Integrated Honour's degree: these four-year courses include advanced coursework and a major research or creative project in your final year.

Successful UWA Foundation students are also eligible to apply for one of UWA's Assured Pathways. These pathways will increase your career opportunities in professional areas such as medicine, law, architecture and more, guaranteeing your place in the professional postgraduate degree of your choice at the start of your studies (subject to satisfactory performance in your Bachelor's degree). Combining an undergraduate and postgraduate degree, Assured Pathways typically have higher progression grades.
