




Program Options

2+2 University Transfer

Complete the first two years of general education and academic major requirements at Shoreline, either online or in person, to earn an Associate of Arts or Science degree. Then, with guidance from our expert academic advisors, apply and transfer to universities across the United States where you complete your final two years and earn your bachelor's degree.





















High School Completion Plus

This early college program allows you to begin your college-level studies early and go on to finish your four-year degree early too! **Save time and money** by taking classes to complete a U.S. high school diploma and associate's degree **at the same time.** This program is open to students who have completed the equivalent of 9th grade in the U.S., are at least 16 years old, and in strong academic standing.

Shoreline has Transfer Admission Guarantees (TAG) with the institutions listed below. Students can request a TAG letter of conditional admission from one of these schools on their Shoreline application for admission. If admitted to Shoreline, students will receive a conditional letter of acceptance from the chosen university along with their Shoreline admission letter. Students are not required to transfer to that institution; however, it is a great option to have!

Learn English at Shoreline

Shoreline offers beginning to advanced level English classes. The advanced levels, English for Academic Purposes (EAP), help you move into regular college classes with emphasis on reading and writing about academic topics. If you have demonstrated English proficiency (see tests below), you may be eligible to enroll directly into college-level English or be placed in advanced English language courses.

If your prior English proficiency test score does not qualify, or you have not taken an English placement test, you will take our English placement test during orientation to determine class placement.

Native-Level English Speakers

International students who have been at institutions for at least 5 years in which English was the primary language across the curriculum are eligible for Directed Self Placement. This is the same assessment given to U.S. residents and citizens enrolling at Shoreline.

ACADEMIC ADVISING

International Student Academic Advisors are faculty advisors who help students make important decisions about their academic and future career plans. By working with an advisor, students are able to make the connection between their academic interests, degree requirements, and career opportunities.



ESL AND ACADEMIC TUTORING

Students are eligible for FREE individual, one-on-one online tutoring for any Shoreline course they're taking for credit. This service is for those who need regular, weekly support studying their class materials.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR



Shoreline operates on a quarter system, which divides the academic year into three 10-week quarters (plus an 8-week summer quarter if students would like to take more classes) instead of two 15-week semesters.

Admission Requirements

The application process at Shoreline is simple, fast, and convenient. You can start at Shoreline four different times throughout the year: January, March, June, and September.

Submission of English proficiency is not required for admission but highly recommended.

- Application (\$50 fee)
- A bank statement or letter from sponsor (bank statement) must be current and show a minimum balance of \$21,150)
- High school transcripts (academic records)

Applicants must be 16 years old or older by the start of International Student Orientation
